Respite Care

Our respite program provides temporary care to families who are caring for a child with a life-limiting illness.

Caring for a child with a life-limiting illness can be difficult. Taking a much-needed break is often the best way to ensure mental and physical well-being. Our respite programs provide temporary care to families during a difficult journey. Respites are simply short breaks that allow families to rest, rejuvenate and for children to develop new relationships and have fun. Our respite care program offers:

- Up to 28 days of pre-booked respite care per year, based on availability at Roger Neilson Children's Hospice.
- Up to 72 hours of emergency respite if you become ill and are unable to care for your child or if there is an emergency in your family.
- Additional respite care time may be considered based on availability.





We are there for children and families from the early stages of a life-limiting illness to end-of-life care and grief support.



Admissions for Respite Care

Up to 28 days of respite per calendar year is available to each child.
